Each year, N.C. public school students must take state-mandated tests: reading and math in grades 3-8 and tests in eight core subjects in high school. The results are part of the state's ABC school rating system, which determines whether school performance grows year to year. Following are Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools preliminary scores on those tests for 2004-05. The school system provides more information on its Web site (www.cms.k12.nc.us). CMS High School Scores

Here are preliminary 2005 pass rates on End of Course exams. Some schools' overall scores include a small number of physical science exams. Waddell did not report physics scores because fewer than five students took the exam. Many top math students take Algebra I and geometry in middle school, which can result in lower performance in most high schools. Northwest, which includes grades six through 12, includes scores for those students; other schools do not include grades six-eight. The overall 2005 CMS results are for high schools only.
